Policy overview & topics not to miss in 2024

In 2024, Europe's agenda will be dominated by the European Parliamentary elections scheduled for June. However, many energy and environmental policy topics still need to be finalised, implemented, and strategically navigated to ensure a sustainable and forward-looking future.

EU Climate Targets

In 2024, the Commission will adopt a 2040 climate target and the greenhouse gas (GHG) budget for the 2030-2050 period.

On 6th February the Commission will present its recommendation.

 The European Scientific Advisory Board on Climate Change has recommended net emissions reductions of 90-95% by 2040, relative to 1990 levels.

Batteries Regulation

The Commission is working on the secondary legislation of the Batteries Regulation, which entered into force on 17th August 2023.

- Battery stakeholders, led by the Joint Research Centre, are developing the Methodology for the Carbon Footprint Calculation (Article 7).
- An online workshop on battery label design is scheduled for February 21st, led by Ramboll on behalf of the Commission (Article 13).

The stakeholders' consultation meeting on the Delegated Act for setting minimum requirements for the performance and durability of batteries is planned for February 22nd (Article 10).

Net-Zero Industry Act (NZIA)

A compromise agreement is expected in early 2024. The Belgian Presidency of the Council of the EU has highlighted the finalisation of the NZIA as one of its priorities.

 Trilogues began in December 2023 and are ongoing.

Critical Raw Materials Act (CRMA)

In December 2023, the European Parliament voted to approve an agreement reached with the Council on the CRMA.

The legislation still needs to be formally endorsed by the Council before it can become law.

 In January 2024 EIT InnoEnergy and Demeter launched the €500 million European battery raw materials fund.

PFAS restriction proposal

The European Chemicals Agency (ECHA) proposed a restriction of per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) in February 2023 and received over 5 600 responses to its public consultation.

The ECHA is currently processing the received feedback.

In March 2024 the RAC will focus on the evaluation of certain consumer uses of PFAS, excluding batteries.

Electricity Market Design (EMD)

In December 2023, the Council and the Parliament reached a provisional agreement on the EMD Regulation.

The provisional agreement now needs to be endorsed and formally adopted by both the Council and the Parliament before it can become law

Energy Performance of Buildings Directive (EPBD)

An agreement between the Parliament and the Council was reached on 7 December. It states that all new buildings should be zero-emission as of 2030; new buildings occupied or owned by the public sector should be zero-emission as of 2028.

The informal agreement now needs to be endorsed by both Parliament and Council before it can become law.

Strategic Technologies for Europe Platform (STEP)

The Commission proposed the creation of a STEP on 20 June 2023. STEP would rely on the reprogramming of funds under existing EU instruments and would also come with an additional budget of €10 billion.

- In January 2024, the Council reached a partial mandate that proposes to reduce STEP's additional funding to a mere €1.5 billion directed only to the European Defence Fund.
- The European Parliament adopted its position before the end of 2023, proposing to increase STEP's additional funding to €13 billion.
- The discussions in Brussels are ongoing, and both institutions are expected to enter negotiations soon.

European Institutions the year of change

From June 6th to 9th, 2024, elections will take place for the European Parliament's 9th parliamentary term, which will run from 2024 to 2029.

- The European Council will adopt the EU's strategic agenda for 2024-2029, agreeing on the EU's political priorities for the future.
- EU Member States will be required to submit their updated national energy and climate plans (NECPs) by 30th June 2024.
- Between June and July, the European Council will propose a new candidate to be the next president of the European Commission.
